


最上川舟運の歴史とロマンのまち



Townscape

Tsukinuno River originates in the Asahi Mountain Range (one of Japan's 100 Famous Mountains) and flows into the Mogami River in Oe Town. The area is blessed with abundant nature. Oe Town's central area, Aterazawa, flourished as a river port and transport hub for Mogami River shipping during the Genroku period of the Edo era. This river pathway connected Sakata and Yonezawa, acting as a cultural artery for Yamagata. Elegant culture from Kyoto flowed down the Mogami River. This gave rise to a flourishing boat transport culture. Out of this culture arose the Autumn Festival where splendid festival floats parade through the town and the Hina Doll Festival. Storehouses reminiscent of that era's prosperity remain today. This landscape has been designated as an Important Cultural Landscape. It is considered a National Treasure of Scenery by the Japanese government.

Town Center Exchange Hall (ATERA)

The building is located in the Central Street Shopping District This area features many preserved traditional townhouses with deep layouts. The store fronts face the main street while the storehouses and residences are located in the back. The building that houses the Exchange Hall was once a bank. It was completed in the early Showa period, but now features a modern western style design. Inside vou can find a vault room with thick doors and walls, remnants of the old bank. Enjoy a moment in the cafe amidst this modern atmosphere




Nihon Ichi Park

(Official Name: National Historic Site Aterazawa Tateyama Castle Ruins Park)

This historic park was developed on the site of a mountain castle built by the Oe clan, who ruled this area in medieval times. From the park, you can gaze upon the majestic flow of the Mogami River, known as the mother river of Yamagata, and the mountains of Zao and the Asahi Mountain Range, Selected as a Mogami River Viewpoint, it offers truly spectacular views





Old Mogami Bridge

This three arch bridge spans the Mogami River. It is highly regarded as a modern civil engineering heritage site for its decorative piers and railings as well as its curved beauty reflected on the water. It stands as a symbol of the Mogami River. The view from the new Mogami Bridge is also superb, making it a prime photo spot for breathtaking scenery.



Mogami River Boat Song Monument

Oe Town is the birthplace of the "Mogami River Boat Song," a folk song representative of Yamagata Prefecture. This monument was erected in the park to commemorate this culturally significant song

The song goes,

 Yo-e, Sa-no, Magga-sho Enva Kora Magase Saka-ta-sa-igu-sa-ge-tassha-dero-cha 🕽

Singing this song while enjoying the spectacular view will refresh your spirit.



During the Edo period this street was lined with the homes of the most pro merchants in the Aterazawa domain. Many Sake brewers had also set up shop along this street.

The old houses with their tile roofs, earthen walls, storehouses, and ancient pines still quietly convey the former prosperity of the Mogami River shipping trade. The Seino Family residence, located along Haramachi Street, boasts the largest scale and finest quality among the merchant houses and stands as the central building on the street. In the early modern period, they operated a sake brewery. Now a days, during the March Doll Festival, Hina dolls are displayed in the sitting

Asahi Mountain Range Kodera **Information Center**

The center is located at the Kodera Trailhead, which is the starting point for climbing Mount O-Asahi. Asahi is the main peak of the Asahi Mountain Range and one of

Japan's 100 Famous Mountains. The center offers lodging facilities and a parking lot for up to 200 vehicles. The surrounding area features the Kodera Valley. The valley offers prime opportunities to enjoy hiking and driving in the foothills. It also an ideal location to enjoy the June greenery as well as the October autumn foliage.



Daizumori Nature Park

From the parking lot walk about 1 km along a walking path through a beautiful beech forest to reach the summit plaza. At an elevation of 984m, the plaza features an observation deck offering close-up views of the Asahi Mountain Range ridges. Mount Gassan and Mount Zao are also visible. From here visitors can enjoy a magnificent 360-degree panoramic vista

Kodera Valley (Jintsu Gorge)

This gorge was carved over thousands of years by water flowing from mountains including Mount Koasahi in the Asahi Mountain Range. Surrounded by steep cliffs on both sides, it's pristine natural beauty has been preserved. It is a magical place with clear streams cascading over massive and bizarrely shaped rocks. The mystical beauty of nature's changing colors from fresh greenery in spring, to lush green foliage in summer, and vibrant colored leaves in autumncaptivates visitors throughout the seasons. The best time to see the fresh greenery is from late May to June, and the best time for autumn leaves is late October.



Mountain Village Community Center (Yamasa-be)

This lodging facility for outdoor and cultural experiences was created by renovating a former elementary school building. It offers various activities to enjoy nature and the countryside. It also features a gymnasium, making it suitable for sports training camps and



River Trekking



This is the most popular experience offered at Yamasabe. It offers an exciting chance to play in the Tsukinuno River, located right in front of the center. Participants can wade. walk, swim, and jump into the river. It's popular not only with children but also with adults. Nature guides will insure you have a fun and safe experience while enjoying the natural surroundings

Oyama Nature Park

From late May to early June each year, approximately 60,000 himesayuri, a type of lily, bloom throughout the park. The park features an observation deck offering a 360-degree panoramic view of the Asahi Mountain Range, Mt. Gassan, Mt. Hayama, and Mt. Zao. A grassy park area with playground equipment is available, along with cottages and a campground with sanitary facilities.



Terme Hakuryo Health Hot Spring

This hot spring has a high concentration of minerals, which is rare even in Japan. It's color changes to six different colors, such as emerald green and milky white, depending on the day. The water is said to be effective for diabetes and neuralgia. This hot spring is loved by many people from inside and outside the prefecture for its high quality. There is also a large open-air bath and a toron sauna. There is also a restaurant, so you can take a bath, eat delicious food, and relax and refresh yourself for a day.

Himesayuri is a rare plant found in the Asahi and lide mountain ranges and the Azuma

delicate pink blossoms. In Oe Town, they can be seen in the Asahi Mountain Range a



Oku Oe Yanagawa Hot Springs

This hot spring facility is located in the Yanagawa district, a heavy snowfall mountain valley west of town. The water at this hotspring is known for its excellent heat retention properties, so much so that it is also called "Netsu no Yu" (Hot Water). It is said to be effective for arteriosclerosis and chronic skin diseases. The water can also be drunk, providing numerous health benefits. Enjoy a feeling of paradise in the open-air bath while gazing at the town's famous hydrangeas and taking in views of the foothills of the Asahi Mountain Range. The Facility also consists of a store and lodging facilities. The area hosts a Wild Vegetable Festival in spring and a Fresh Buckwheat Festival in

History and Culture Nurtured by the Mogami River



History and Folklore Museum

Located in the Shichiken district this museum features the main house and storehouse of the Saito family. The family amassed their wealth through sericulture, the commercial rearing of silk warms. The structures were relocated from deep in the mountains, over ten kilometers away. The main house displays numerous old household tools and farming implements, while the storehouse exhibits materials related to sericulture. Every March, it displays antique and modern Hina dolls donated by townspeople.







Goshinji Temple's Seated Statue of

Kokai-in Temple Gate

It is said to be the gate of a castle built by Sakai Naotsugu, lord of the Aterazawa domain, on the Kourushi River. The construction date is estimated to be between 1622 and the beginning of the Kan'ei Era, with the relocation to Kokai-in occurring around 1648. It is designated as a Town Cultural Property.

Graves of Sakai Naotsugu, Lord of Aterazawa Castle, and his wife (Kokai-in) Kokai-in houses the graves of Sakai Naotsugu and his wife members of

the the Sakai family. The family descended from Sakai Tadatsugu, the

foremost of the Tokugawa Shitenno (Four Heavenly Kings). Sakai Naotsugu played a crucial role in building the Kourushi River Castle and developing the castle town of Aterazawa. Naotsugu's grave is a five-ringed stupa inscribed with "Kan'ei Sha Mizunototori year" (Kanei 10th year, 1633).



Yamagata Daikai Gyu (Manatee) (Reconstructed Model, Nickname: Puku-chan)

In 1978, skeletal fossils were discovered in the riverbed of the Mogami River flowing through the town. At the time, Dr. Domning, a sirenian researcher,

identified them as fossils of a globally significant new species of giant sea cow, naming it "Yamagata Daikai Gyu". The fossils are managed by Yamagata Prefecture as a Designated Prefectural Cultural Property. The town has created a life-size replica, which is displayed at the Town Community Center. (MAP 14)

Jindai Kaya

Amida Nvorai

Housed in a temple in the Misato

district, this statue was created in the

late Heian period (12th century) and is

one of the largest seated statues of its

era in the prefecture. Its facial features

recall the Amida Nyorai statue (by

Jocho) in the Phoenix Hall of Byodoin

Temple in Kyoto. Carved from a single

block of wood, it is thought to be the

work of a local sculptor imitating

the Jocho style. It is designated as

a Yamagata Prefectural Cultural

With a root circumference of about 9 meters, it consists of 5 main trunks and 9 large branches. The thickest trunk has a circumference of about 3.5 meters. Its branches spread like a cup, and it is estimated to be about 1,500 years old. It reaches a height of about 19 meters. It is designated as a Yamagata Prefecture Natural Monument.



Matsubo's Great Cedar

With a root circumference of about 15 meters, it reaches a height of approximately 26 meters. Numerous branches spread out and droop downward reaching about 3 meters above ground level. It is said to be about 1,100 years old. It has been designated as a Natural Monument of Yamagata Prefecture.



The Mogami River Nurtures Vitality

Hinamatsuri (Girls' Day)

Oe Town flourished as a river port and transit point for the Mogami River waterway. The Kyoto culture and Hina doll culture brought by the river transport have been treasured and preserved. In late March, precious and carefully preserved antique dolls are displayed at venues like historic houses in Aterazawa and the Historical and Folk Museum. Every year on March 29th, the Hina Market is held, bustling with stalls



Lily Festival

Held at Oyama Natural Park from late May to early June. The forest fills with delicate pink Himesayuri lilies. The contrast between the green of the forest trees and the pink of the Himesayuri is exceptionally beautiful. Various events are held during the festival period drawing large crowds.



Local Products & Tastes Festival

A variety of events are held. Venders will gather in full force to display autumn's delicacies, as well Oe's specialty products. Delicious seasonal fruits such as La France pears and

apples will be a sale. A grand raffle will also be held. As part of the Sea-Mountain Exchange. vendors from Watari Town, in Miyagi Prefecture, will also participate. Enjoy autumn in Oe Town with family and friends.

Autumn Festival

It is held in conjunction with the annual festival at Aterazawa Hachiman Shrine. It features the lion dance that has been passed down for about 700 years, the Hayashi float, built in the 1840s and local performing artist from each district. Kourushigawa dashi and mikoshi can be seen in front of Aetrazawa Station. A market selling local specialties will also be held.



Thousands of fireworks illuminating the night sky and about a thousand lanterns reflecting on the surface of the Mogami River create a truly fantastical scene. With fireworks launched from three locations, the viewing spots along the Mogami Riverbank offer an up-close and incredibly powerful experience. Enjoy this feast of sound, light, and water.

Local Sake

Oe Town is said to be particularly well-suited for cultivating sake rice. Here the master brewers are highly skilled in their techniques. The local sake "Oe Nishiki" is made by highly polishing the sake rice varieties "Miyama Nishiki" and "Dewa San San," using spring water from the Asahi Mountain Range. It comes in varieties such as Honjozo and Daiginjo. Shochu is also made here using sake lees, a byproduct of sake production.



Yamagata's famous rice varieties, such as Tsuyahime, Yukiwakamaru, and Haenuki, are produced here. During the spring rice planting season, the chorus of frogs echoes throughout the fields, and in autumn, the golden hues of the rice ears spread across the entire town.



Apples, La France pears, cherries, peaches, plums and grapes are just a few of the wide variety of delicious fruits grown here. The significant temperature differences in this region result in fruits with exceptionally high sugar content.



Spring brings mountain delicacies like komatsuna, bracken, and bamboo shoots, while autumn offers mushrooms like nameko.



At the Mogami River's tourist fishing spots, wild ayu are caught every year during the fall ayu season from mid-September to mid-October. "Fall-run ayu" refers to ayu that migrate downstream during the autumn spawning season. Female fall-run ayu offer a texture unique to them, known as "egg-bearing," which summer ayu lack. Males are also said to develop "a firmer texture and a matured umami sweetness." Savor the indescribable, fragrant flavor of ayu.




Yamagata Jidori chicken inherits the deliciousness of the Akasasa Shamo breed, offering a rich, satisfying flavor with a firm texture without an unpleasant aftertaste. It is highly regarded for its higher umami content than broiler chicken. It is rich in collagen, making it a popular healthy choice.



Peach seed crafts made from peach pits. Their unique patterns and texture make them perfect as souvenirs or gifts. Additional crafts include classic tea caddies, tea sets and trays as well as nature and necklases.



In the past, there was a custom of making the first pilgrimage to Dewa Sanzan at age fifteen. It is said that during this pilgrimage, rice crackers shaped like coins with holes in them were offered as an offering.



White bean paste blended with La France pear pulp, baked into the shape of a whole La France pear. Enjoy its gentle sweetness and refreshing aroma.



Aoso, also known as mao is a plant that has been used since ancient times as a material for kimonos and other items. From the Edo period until before World War II, Oe Town was renowned nationwide as a producer of high-quality aoso. Nowadays, not only the fibers are used, but the leaves are also made into a paste and used in various dishes. Aoso leaves are rich in polyphenols and calcium. Aosso hiyamugi and udon, made by kneading in aoso leaves, are very popular.

Roadside Station Oe (Koramagase)

On National Route 287 a new Roadside Station Oe "Koramagase" has opened in the Hakuryo area, the gateway to Oe Town. Look for the building and large sign, modeled after the "Koukaibune" boats used for shipping on the Mogami River. Inside you will find a corner selling fresh agricultural products directly from producers and a bakery where you can enjoy freshly baked bread. There is also a wide selection of souvenirs.




Ogura Community Center (Ikikiki Juhassai, Farmers' Market)

This farmer to consumer sales facility is located in the Juhassai district. It carries locally produced items rarely found in supermarkets, such as items made from local bamboo shoots and mushrooms. Inside the facility, you can see displays of traditional local tools and earthenware excavated from archaeological sites. The people living in Juhassai are said to be forever 18. The local produce is like a fountain of youth. Eating fresh vegetables from the direct sales shop in Juhassai might just make you feel five years younger.


